## Collective worship at St. Stephen's

## Attendance



As you know attendance continues to be a huge priority for us as a school. Achieving good attendance requires the school and home to work closely together.

Our attendance figures are monitored on a regular basis by the school and our Attendance Officer. At our monthly meetings, we look at attendance figures that have dipped. We are particularly concerned about individual pupils who are defined as 'persistently absent'. The government defines children whose attendance falls below 90% as 'persistent absentees'. If your child does fall under this category we will ask you to come in for a meeting, so we can discuss ways in which we can work together to improve your child's attendance. On some occasions we may also carry out a home visit after 3 days or more of absence.

We are committed to working together to help our children learn well, every day.

# Holidays

Family holidays will not be authorised during term time. Government legislation does not give any entitlement to parents to take their child on holiday during term time. If you do take your child on holiday during term time this may result in a Penalty Notice Fine. Penalty Notice Fines for holidays in term time are £60 per parent per child if paid within 21 days and £120 if paid between 22 and 28 days.

## **School Improvement Priorities**



Our SLT and staff team continue to work closely with The Sycamore Trust to continue our school improvement journey this year. We remain committed to ensuring St Stephen's provides the very best learning environment





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and is a place where all children and staff flourish. All our work this year will fall under one of the following 3 key priorities:

- 1. To improve attainment outcomes through high quality teaching and effective use of assessment.
- 2. To develop consistent approaches to teaching and learning to ensure that all children succeed.
- 3. To use wider strategies to address non-academic barriers to learning.

# WOW – Walk to School Campaign

If you are new to school, you may not know about our WOW badge incentive system. Each day your child records the way they travel to school on an online database. They may have travelled by car, on foot, park and stride, scooter or bike. If your child has ONE active journey each week, at the end of the month they will receive a WOW badge to wear on their uniform with pride. The scheme promotes looking after the planet whilst staying active, it also helps prevent congestion around school and helps keep everyone safe from traffic.

# Nut Allergy Awareness for Packed Lunches, Snacks and Treats



As we have a number of children in school with nut allergies, we would like to remind you that food items that contain nuts <u>must not</u> be brought into school. The risk of cross-contamination from nuts is too high to allow any of these foods

in school. Anaphylaxis is a potentially life-threatening reaction that impairs breathing and can send the body into shock. Given this information, we ask that you carefully check the labels of any food in packed lunches, snacks or treats to ensure that they do not contain nuts. With this in mind, we know that some parents like to send in a class treat to celebrate their child's birthday, we respectfully ask that you choose a small item that can

be shared by all of our children e.g. a class book, pencils or a piece of fruit. Thank you for your co-operation and understanding in this matter.
